We also celebrated Poppy Day by remembering the brave soldiers that fought for our country during the wars.





Our DT project required us to use computer assisted design software to develop a net to create a gift box. These gift boxes took a lot of resilience to complete but everyone was successful!




Dahl Class

Y5 Blackman Class






Geography


